Our next meeting is on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2004 at the Royal College of Physicians. Potential Speakers include:

- Dr Jack Parry-Jones      **Nutrition and the ITU.** Dr Parry-Jones is an ITU Consultant, he will be talking about this area to us.
- Dr Lionel Milgrom      **Quantum Aspects of Patient Practitioner Interaction in Classical Homeopathy.** This will be a two part presentation, both before coffee in the morning and after coffee. This is a sufficiently large topic to need adequate time to explain, as it is such an unusual area.
- Dr Carol O'Toole      An experienced Immunologist, Dr O'Toole will talk to us on **'Does Natural Killer Cell Activity control Tumours or merely implicate their presence?'**
- Dr Roy Rutherford      He will be talking to us on **'Exercising the Brain, an Alternative and Natural Approach to Alleviating the Symptoms of Dyslexia/Dyspraxia and Attention Deficient**

**Hyperactivity Disorder.'** Dr Rutherford working in the area of cerebellar dysfunction in children.

Re-appraisals will be done by arrangement with each doctor in London. The fee is £175 (please note this is a lot less than the Independent Doctors Forum who charge £500). You will need to have attended one BSIM Conference and two other Conferences during the course of the year. This is for continued professional development. Each BSIM Conference accrues 7 CPD points for each doctor attending.
